#### Summary Report: Model United Nations (MUN) Conference 2024

On October 14, 2024, A.V. College of Arts, Science & Commerce (Hyderabad), in collaboration with NIILM University (Haryana), SINSME Foundation, and ICERT, successfully organized an international Model United Nations (MUN) Conference. The event commemorated World Students' Day and the birth anniversary of Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam.

#### Conference Highlights and Committees

The hybrid conference engaged students in simulated UN environments to address critical global humanitarian and social issues:

- UN General Assembly (UNGA): Focussed on fostering lasting peace and stability in the Israeli-Palestinian Conflict.
- UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD): Addressed the path to social inclusion and reasonable accommodation for the 1.3 billion individuals living with disabilities globally.
- UN Human Rights Council (UNHRC): Dedicated to protecting the homeland and livelihood rights of Indigenous People.
- World Health Assembly (WHA): Focused on the urgent intersection of Mental Health and Youth.
- Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC): Debated the role of the Global Digital Compact in economic advancement.

#### Delegate Participation and Allotments

Students from diverse institutions, such as St. Ann's College for Women, Manthan International School, and G. Narayanamma Institute of Technology, represented various nations including the USA, India, South Africa, Australia, Russia, and Israel. Participants developed essential skills in diplomacy, public speaking, and international research.

The conference concluded with the Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam Excellence Award 2024, honoring adolescents and undergraduate students (ages 14-25) for their innovation, creativity, and dedication to social contribution.
